MAGMA HEART NECKLACE By: Sara Ellis




Materials

- Beadalon 19 Strand Stringing Wire in Bright JW14T-0 (1 20 inch strand, 2 12 inch strands, 2 6 inch strands)
- 238 4mm Maroon Glass Pearls
- 6 3mm Bicones
- 1 4mm Bicone
- 10 Beadalon #1 Silver Crimp Beads JFC1S- 25Z
- 10 Beadalon 4mm Silver Crimp Covers 349B-010
- 4 Beadalon Silver Tone 15 Hole Spacer Bars JSKIT0295
- 2 Beadalon Silver 4mm Jump Rings 314B-003
- 1 Beadalon Silver Head Pin 312B-013
- 2 3mm Silver Beads
- 1 12mm Red Magma Swarovski Crystal Heart Bead
- 1 Beadalon Medium Silver EZ-Lobster Clasp 315B-221
 - Tools:
- Beadalon Designer Sparkle Chain Nose Pliers 201A-101
- Beadalon Designer Sparkle Cutter 202A-105
- Beadalon Mighty Crimper Tool JTCRIMP3
- Beadalon Designer Sparkle Round Nose Pliers 201A-104
- 1. Prepare your Magma Crystal Heart Bead. Thread the heart bead and 4mm bicone onto the head pin.
- 2. Using your chain nose pliers, bend the head pin 90 degrees and snip the end with your cutter tool, leaving approximately ½ inch of the pin.
- 3. Using your round nose pliers, grasp the end of the pin and roll into a loop. Set your finished bead aside.
- 4. Prepare your EZ-Lobster Clasp. Using your chain nose pliers, close the clasp over a 4mm jump ring and set aside.
- 5. Loop your 20 inch strand of stringing wire around 1 jump ring, threading both ends through a #1 crimp bead.
- 6. Using your chain nose pliers, gently close the crimp bead over the wires, making sure the wires sit side-by-side within the crimp bead.
- 7. Using your Mighty Crimp tool, close a crimp cover over the crimp bead. Because the crimp cover is significantly larger than the crimp bead, no further crimping is needed.
- 8. String glass pearls and 3mm bicones in the following pattern 16 pearls, 1 crystal, 10 pearls, 1 crystal, 10 pearls, 1 crystal, 10 pearls.
- 9. String on 1 3mm silver bead.
- 10. Thread the end of your wire through the top hole of 1 15 hole spacer bar.





- 11. Thread three glass pearls.
- 12. Thread the end of your wire though the top hole of another 15 hole spacer bar.
- 13. Thread three glass pearls.
- 14. Thread the end of your wire through the top hole of another 15 hole spacer bar.
- 15. Thread three glass pearls.
- 16. Thread the end of your wire though the top hole of one more 15 hole spacer bars. You have now threaded a total of 4 spacer bars.
- 17. String 1 3mm silver bead.
- 18. String glass pearls and 3mm bicones in the following pattern 10 pearls, 1 crystal, 10 pearls, 1 crystal, 10 pearls, 1 crystal, 16 pearls.
- 19. Loop the end of your wire through the jump ring/EZ-Lobster Clasp combo and thread the ends through a #1 crimp bead.
- 20. Pull the wire so that the crimp bead sits as close to the glass pearls as possible, leaving enough room for a crimp cover.
- 21. Using your chain nose pliers, gently close the crimp bead over the wires, making sure that the wires sit side-by-side within the crimp bead.
- 22. Using the Mighty Crimp Tool, close a crimp cover over the crimp bead.
- 23. Crimp a #1 crimp bead on the end of one of your 6 inch strands of stringing wire, leaving a 1 inch tail.
- 24. Starting at the top of the first 15 hole spacer bar you've used, count down three holes and thread your wire though the hole.
- 25. Thread on 4 glass pearls.
- 26. Thread your wire through the third hole of the next spacer bar.
- 27. Thread on 2 glass pearls, your prepared Magma heart bead and 2 glass pearls.
- 28. Thread your wire though the third hole of the next spacer bar.
- 29. Thread on 4 glass pearls.
- 30. Thread on 1 #1 crimp bead.
- 31. Slide the crimp bead as close to the edge of the spacer bar as possible, leaving enough room for a crimp cover.
- 32. Using your chain nose pliers, gently squeeze the crimp bead closed over the single strand of wire.
- 33. Using the Might Crimp tool, close a crimp cover over the crimp bead. The crimp bead inside acts as a "stopper" to hold your wire in place through the spacer bars.
- 34. Using your Cutter tool, snip the tail of the wire exiting the crimp cover so that it is flush with the crimp cover hole.
- 35. Repeat the same process on the other side. Close a crimp cover over the crimp bead and snip the end of the wire.
- 36. So far, your necklace should look like image 36.











- 37. Loop 1 12 inch strand of stringing wire through the jump ring end of your necklace where you began, though a #1 crimp bead. You will have two strands on the same jump ring.
- 38. Using your chain nose pliers, gently squeeze the crimp bead closed over the wires so that the wires sit side-by-side within the crimp bead.
- 39. Using your cutter tool, snip the tail of the wire as close to the crimp bead as possible.
- 40. Using your Mighty Crimp tool, close a crimp cover over the crimp bead.
- 41. Thread on 46 glass pearls.
- 42. Thread the end of the wire through the first 15 hole spacer bar in the eighth hole on the spacer bar (counting from the top).
- 43. Slide a #1 crimp bead onto the wire. Slide the crimp bead as close to the 15 hole spacer bar as possible, leaving enough room for a crimp cover and squeeze closed with your chain nose pliers.
- 44. Using the Mighty Crimp tool, close a crimp cover over the crimp bead.
- 45. Snip the wire exiting the crimp cover with your Cutter tool so that the wire is flush with the hole of the crimp cover.
- 46. Repeat steps 37-45 on the other side of your necklace, starting on the jump ring/EZ-Lobster Clasp side.
- 47. Your necklace should look like image 47.
- 48. Thread a #1 crimp bead onto a strand of 6 inch stringing wire and squeeze closed, leaving a 1 inch tail.
- 49. Thread the wire through the second to last hole in the first 15 hole spacer bar.
- 50. Thread on 9 glass pearls.
- 51. Thread the wire through the second to last hole on the next 15 hole spacer bar.
- 52. Thread on 9 glass pearls.
- 53. Thread the wire through the second to last hole on the next 15 hole spacer bar.
- 54. Thread on 9 glass pearls.
- 55. Thread the wire through the second to last hole on the last 15 hole spacer bar.
- 56. Slide on a #1 Crimp bead down as close to the 15 hole spacer bar as possible, leaving enough room for a crimp cover and squeeze closed.
- 57. Using the Mighty Crimp tool, close a crimp cover over the crimp bead.
- 58. Snip the exiting wire with the Cutter tool so that it is flush with the hole of the crimp cover.
- 59. Repeat the steps 57 and 58 on the other side.
- 60. Your necklace is finished!
