

MARISOL BRACELET

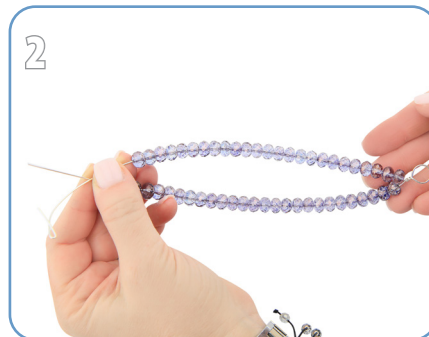


Materials

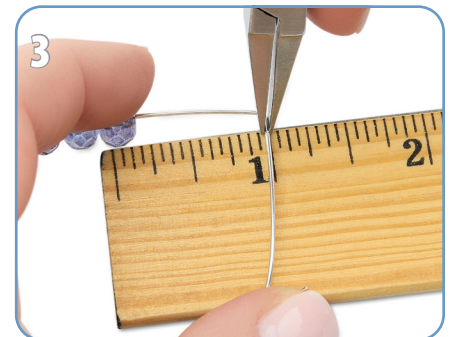
- 22 Gauge MultiColor Artistic Wire
 - 20 Gauge German Style Wire
 - appx. 50 8mm rondelle beads
 - Lobster Clasp
 - Jump Ring
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- Tools:
 - Nylon Jaw Pliers
 - Bail Making Pliers
 - Designer Flush Cutter
 - Flat Nose Pliers



1. Cut 20 inches of 20 Gauge German Style Wire. Hold the Bail Making Pliers in the center of the 20 inches of wire and make a loop around the largest barrel of the Pliers. Twist the two wire around twice.



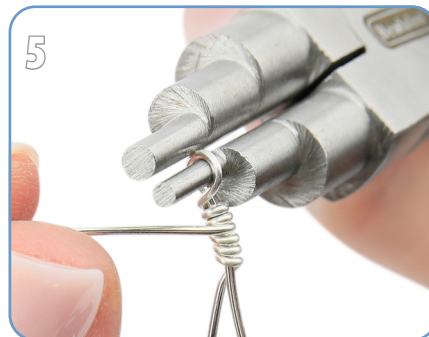
2. String up 25 beads on each wire (you can adjust this bead count more or less depending on the size of your wrist). Bend up the ends of the wire to hold the beads in place.



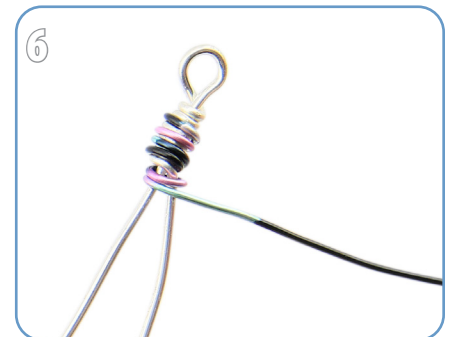
3. Measure about an inch above the beads. Bend one wire down at a 90 degree angle.



4. Wrap the bent wire around the straight wire three times.



5. Create a wrapped loop with the straight wire and trim the ends.



6. Work from the spool and wrap the 22 Gauge MultiColor Artistic Wire around 5 or 6 times under the loop on one side of the bracelet to secure it.



7. Push one bead up to the top of one of the wires. Wrap the MultiColor Artistic Wire around the back, up, and around the bead.



8. Push one bead up from each of the wires and wrap the MultiColor Artistic Wire around the back and around to capture both beads.



9. Repeat step 8 to lock all of the beads in place. When you reach the other end, you'll have one bead left. Wrap around the one bead, and up around the wire to the loop, and back down again.



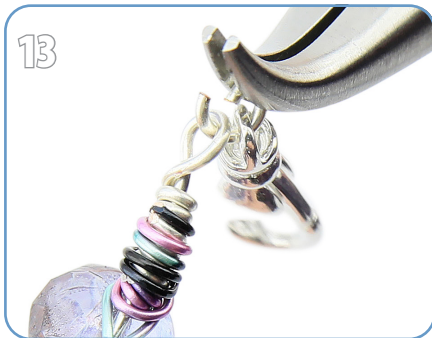
10. Wrap down around that single bead, then continue to criss-cross back down the bracelet in between each of the beads.



11. When you get to the other end, wrap around a few more times, and trim your ends.



12. Use your fingers to shape the bracelet into an oval shape.



13. Use a Jump Ring to add a Lobster Clasp to the side with the smaller loop. Attach the Lobster Clasp to the larger loop for the clasp.
