STEP 1

Use the Round Multi Jump Ring Mandrel to make a coil of 20 gauge wire. Cut about 20 jump rings with the flush cutters.

STEP 2

Cut about a 3 inch (7.6c m) length of 24 gauge wire and make a knotted head pin.

STEP 3

Thread a wood bead onto the head pin and make a wrapped loop at the top. Repeat 5 more times for 6 total.

STEP 4

Cut two lengths of chain 2 inches (5 cm) long.

STEP 5 - Make the earwires

Use the Forming Pliers to make two matching ear wires with the 20 gauge Artistic Wire. Use a needle file to smooth the ends.

STEP 6

Attach one piece of chain to each of the earwires.

STEP 7

Use the jump rings to attach the leaves and wrapped loop beads to the chain.
