

Beachy Vibes Macrame bracelet by Sara Ellis



This beachy vibes macramé bracelet has the whimsy of a knotted friendship bracelet with the security of bead stringing wire and hardware. This bracelet can be lengthened to create a fun ankle bracelet that will have you ready to bury your toes in the sand!

- *B-Lon Tex 210 Nylon Cord*
- *Findings Variety Pack*
- *Crimp Covers Variety Pack*
- *2" Head Pins*
- *Matte Picasso Jasper Stone Beads*
- *G-S Hypo Cement*
- *Sparkle Chain Nose Pliers*
- *Sparkle Bent Chain Nose Pliers*
- *Sparkle Round Nose Pliers*
- *Sparkle Cutter Tool*
- *Tying Station*

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Cut a 16 inch piece of bead stringing wire.
2. Secure one end of the bead stringing wire to the top of the Tying Station.
3. Thread 10 large beads onto the bead stringing wire and secure the bead stringing wire to the bottom of the Tying Station.
4. Cut a 6 foot piece of white B-Lon.
5. Place the B-lon underneath the bead stringing wire at the center of the 6 foot piece.
6. Create four square knots with the B-Lon.
7. Using the right strand of B-Lon create a single strand lark's head knot.
8. Using the left strand of the B-Lon create a single strand lark's head knot.
9. Slide a bead up to the knots and create a single strand lark's head knot around the bead with the right strand.
10. Create a single strand lark's head knot with the left strand.
11. Repeat these steps, creating knots and sliding up beads until you have added all the beads to the bracelet.
12. Create four square knots to finish the length.
13. Remove the bead stringing wire from the Tying Station.
14. Secure the B-Lon ends by tying an overhand knot on the back of the bracelet. Add a drop of G-S Hypo Cement.
15. Thread one end of the bead stringing wire through a crimp tube and a wire guardian and crimp with the crimper tool.
16. Place a crimp cover over the crimp bead.
17. Repeat this process to the opposite end of the bracelet.
18. Using chain nose pliers, attach jump rings and a clasp to the wire guardians.
19. Thread a small bead onto a head pin.
20. Create a wrapped loop at the top of the bead.
21. Repeat these steps until you have created 9 bead charms.
22. Using chain nose pliers, attach the bead charms to the loops in the knots on the bracelet.
