

## ZOOM EARRINGS by Sara Ellis



Look good for your next Zoom meeting! Dress up premade hoop components with wire and beads to create more than one pair of hoop earrings. These easy wire wrapping techniques will have you looking at plain components in a whole new way!

### SUPPLIES:

- Beadalon German Style Wire, Round, 24 gauge, Gold
- Bead Landing Gold Jump Ring Connector, Assorted
- Bead Landing Earring Fish Hook Mix
- Assorted Creations Circle Components by Bead Landing
- Bead Gallery Metallic Czech Glass Faceted Round Beads, 6mm
- Mint Faceted Glass Round Beads by Bead Landing
- Beadalon Sparkle Chain Nose Pliers
- Beadalon Sparkle Bent Chain Nose Pliers
- Beadalon Sparkle Round Nose Pliers
- Beadalon Sparkle Cutter Tool
- Beadalon Nylon Jaw Flat Nose Pliers

### INSTRUCTIONS

1. Cut a 24 inch piece of 24 gauge wire.
2. Anchor the wire to one of the components with three or four wire wraps.
3. Thread three small mint colored beads onto the wire and wire wrap them onto the component with three wraps.
4. Repeat Step 3 until you have added 8 sections of 3 beads onto the component.
5. Secure the wire to the component with three or four wraps and trim the excess.
6. Using nylon jaw pliers, create a knotted head pin and thread two beads onto the headpin.
7. Create a wrapped loop at the top of the beads.
8. Use chain nose pliers and jump rings to attach the ear wire to the component.
9. Repeat Steps 1- 8 to create the second earring.
10. Cut a 30 inch piece of 24 gauge wire.
11. Anchor the wire to the component with three or four wraps.
12. Thread seven Czech glass beads onto the wire.
13. Guide the wire along the outer edge of the component and attach to the other side of the component with three or four wraps.
14. Wire wrap between the beads and around the component several times. Secure the end with wire wraps and trim the excess.
15. Using chain nose pliers and jump rings, attach the ear wire to the component.
16. Repeat Steps 10-15 to create the second earring.
